

Scholarship Overview:

The Dr. Alvin Ring Empowerment Scholarship for Laboratory Professionals, established through the American Society for Clinical Pathology (ASCP), aims to provide financial aid to those pursuing higher education in the medical laboratory sciences. Scholarships range from \$1,000-\$5,000 depending on applicant qualifications and degree program pursued. Scholarship aid may be used toward certification fees, direct academic tuition, or needs-based expenses to support the student's academic career.

We highly recommend you review the entire application and draft your responses to the personal statement prompts in a Word Document prior to submitting your application, as the application software will NOT save partially completed forms.

As a part of the application, you will be asked to UPLOAD a letter of recommendation from a current academic or professional supervisor. If you are unsure whether your letter writer may qualify for this role, please review the Letter of Recommendation section in the FAQs document.

Pre-Requisites:

This scholarship is looking for students from medically-underserved and/or rural areas, seeking to serve medically-underserved communities with their education. Please note: Candidates must be US Citizens to apply.

Candidates must be in good academic standing and/or show commitment to staying in the laboratory profession, as demonstrated by their academic or professional reference letter.

Candidates must also fit one of the following categories:

1. <u>Current high school students</u> starting in a NAACLS-accredited program in Phlebotomy (PBT), Medical Laboratory Assistant (MLA), Medical Laboratory Technician (MLT), Medical Laboratory Science (MLS), or Histotechnology (HTL) by August 31 2025.

2. <u>Current laboratory science students</u> in a NAACLS-accredited program in Phlebotomy (PBT), Medical

Laboratory Assistant (MLA), Medical Laboratory Technician (MLT), Medical Laboratory Science (MLS), or Histotechnology (HTL).

3. <u>Currently an active student in a non-laboratory science field,</u> but starting in a NAACLS-accredited program in Phlebotomy (PBT), Medical Laboratory Assistant (MLA), Medical Laboratory Technician (MLT), Medical Laboratory Science (MLS), or Histotechnology (HTL) by August 31 2025.

4. <u>Currently a working professional (not an active student)</u>, but starting in a NAACLS-accredited program in Phlebotomy (PBT), Medical Laboratory Assistant (MLA), Medical Laboratory Technician (MLT), Medical Laboratory Science (MLS), or Histotechnology (HTL) by August 31 2025.

Please note that Masters and Doctoral program applicants are not eligible for this opportunity.

Award Issuing Terms:

All scholarship recipients are encouraged to enroll as a member of ASCP. <u>ASCP student membership</u> is free of cost.

This scholarship opportunity will be made possible, in part, by Cooperative Agreement number NU470E000107 from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). Scholarship opportunity administration and selection of candidates are the sole responsibility of the American Society for Clinical Pathology, and do not necessarily represent the official views of the CDC. Recipients of CDC-funded scholarship awards will be asked to sign a contract in which they agree to the following:

1. Create a <u>CDC OneLab REACH account</u> to join the CDC OneLab Network and access free training materials for laboratory professionals through CDC's learning management system, OneLab REACH.

2. Complete two CDC OneLab REACH courses of their choosing within the scholarship award year and submit certificates of completion to grants@ascp.org.

3. Complete and submit follow-up surveys from ASCP about their professional journey and career path for 5 years following the award year, and respond to requests for quotes, interviews, or testimonials from ASCP.

4. Proof of enrollment into the laboratory science program supported through this scholarship will be required prior to scholarship awards being distributed. If this is not yet available, proof of application submission into the laboratory science program will be accepted, with the understanding that proof of enrollment should be shared (when available).

5. Provide proof of good academic standing at the time of scholarship fund distribution.

6. Agree not to purchase ASCP products or services using scholarship funds.
